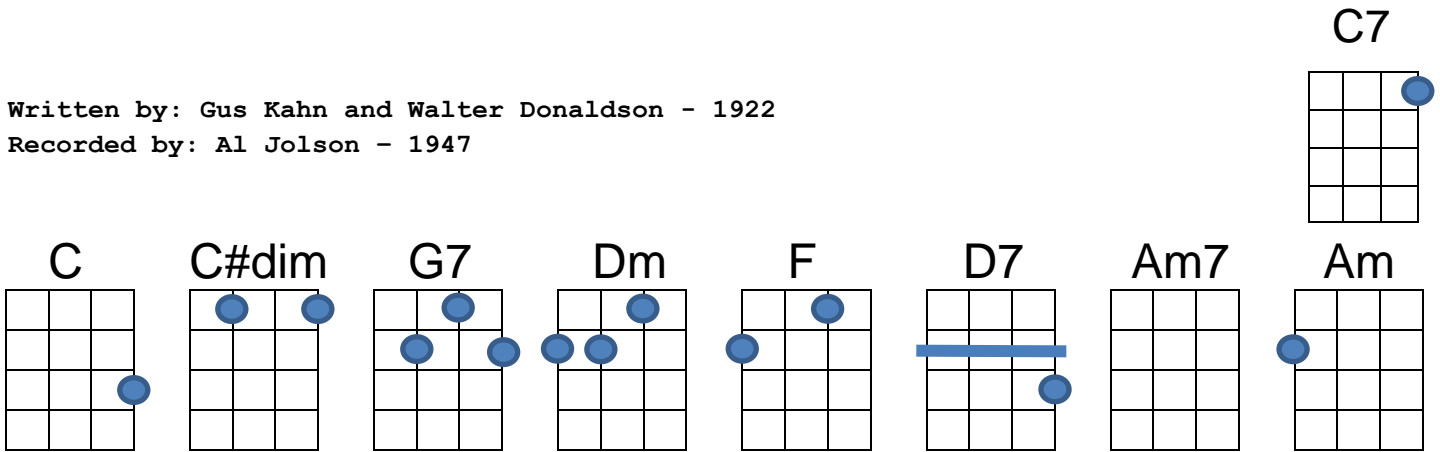


Carolina in the Morning
