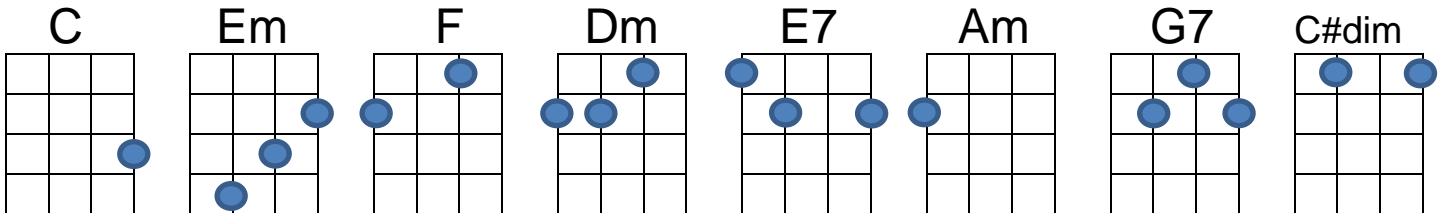
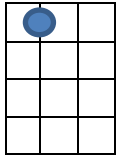


What a Wonderful World
