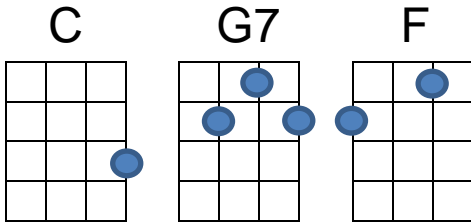


C'mon Everybody
