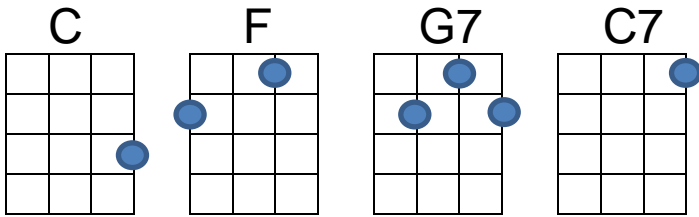


Singing the Blues
