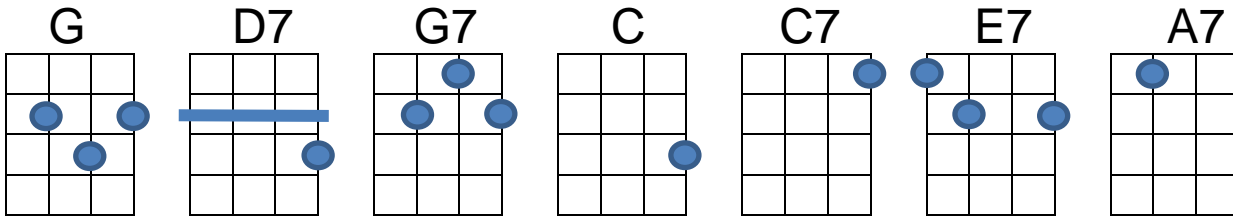


When I'm Sixty Four
