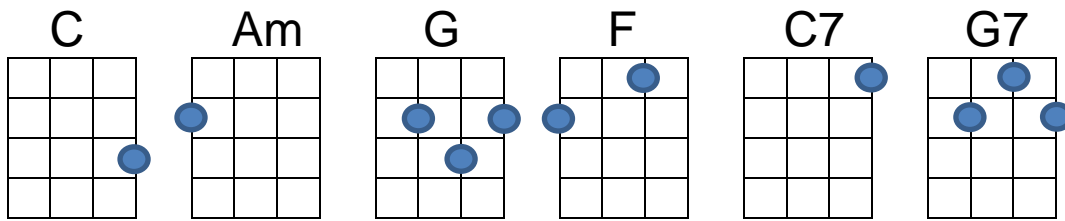


Take Me Home Country Roads
